4	EVERYONE. THANK YOU FOR JOINING THE GOVERNANCE
5	SUBCOMMITTEE. WE HAVE A PRETTY BRIEF AGENDA TODAY,
6	BUT LET'S START WITH ASKING SCOTT TO CALL THE ROLL

2	HAVE A QUORUM.
3	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: EXCELLENT. OKAY.
4	THE TOPIC FOR TODAY IS THE CONSIDERATION OF THE
5	PURCHASING POLICY. AND WE HAVE A PRESENTATION. SO,
6	RAFAEL, I'LL HAND IT OVER TO YOU. THANK YOU.
7	MR. AGUIRRE-SACASA: THANK YOU, JUDY, AND
8	THANK YOU, MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNANCE SUBCOMMITTEE
9	AND OTHER MEMBERS OF CIRM STAFF. APPRECIATE YOU ALL
10	BEING HERE.
11	WE KNOW THAT PURCHASING POLICIES AREN'T AS
12	INTERESTING AS SOME OF THE OTHER CIRM PROGRAMS WE
13	HAVE GOING ON, BUT IT'S ONE OF THE BASIC BUILDING
14	BLOCKS OF ANY STRONG COMPLIANCE PROGRAM. AND SINCE
15	WE HADN'T LOOKED AT THIS SINCE 2016, THE FINANCE AND
16	LEGAL TEAMS, WITH THE ADVICE OF J.T. AND THE
17	GOVERNANCE TEAM, THOUGHT IT WOULD BE A GOOD TIME TO
18	TAKE A LOOK AT IT AND JUST SEE IF WE COULD IMPROVE
19	IT IN ANY, WAY, SHAPE OR FORM.
20	WE THINK WE'RE PRESENTING A NEW POLICY
21	THAT ACCOMPLISHES THOSE GOALS. WHAT IT DOES, AND
22	I'M JUST SUMMARIZING WHAT'S IN THE MEMO HERE, SO,
23	AGAIN, YOU'LL PROBABLY BE FAMILIAR WITH SOME OF
24	THESE WORDS AND THINGS LIKE THAT. BUT JUST WANTED
25	TO GO OVER THIS BEFORE I TOSS IT OVER TO MICHELLE

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1	LEWIS, MY COLLEAGUE, SO SHE CAN GO OVER A BRIEF
2	PRESENTATION FOR YOU.
3	SO, AGAIN, THE NEW POLICY REMOVES A LOT OF
4	EXTRANEOUS CONTENT AND OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES THAT
5	PROBABLY JUST SHOULDN'T BE IN A POLICY. WE'RE GOING
6	FROM SOMETHING LIKE TWENTY PAGES DOWN TO THREE AND A
7	HALF, FOUR PAGES. IT'S GOING TO FOCUS ON
8	PROCUREMENT GOVERNANCE AND COMPLIANCE, CLARITY, AND
9	EFFICIENCY.
10	WE'RE IN THE PROCESS OF DEVELOPING THESE
11	STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES THAT WILL FLOW FROM
12	THE POLICY, BUT OBVIOUSLY WE WANTED TO GET APPROVAL
13	FROM THE ICOC ON THE POLICY ITSELF BEFORE FINALIZING
14	THOSE.
15	WE THINK THAT THIS POLICY WILL BE EASIER
16	TO TRAIN ON, CERTAINLY EASIER TO ADMINISTER. AND
17	ALSO IT WILL BE WE THINK IT'S GOING TO BE EASIER
18	FOR OUR USERS TO COMPREHEND, MORE USER FRIENDLY.
19	WHAT IT DID IS WE REMOVED A WHOLE BUNCH OF
20	DETAILED DEFINITIONS TO FOCUS ON PROCUREMENT
21	GOVERNANCE, AS I TOUCHED UPON EARLIER. WE CLARIFIED
22	CONTRACT TERM LIMITS BY ESTABLISHING A MAXIMUM TERM
23	OF TEN YEARS, INCLUDING EXTENSIONS. WE STANDARDIZED
24	THE APPROVAL AUTHORITY TO ALIGN WITH FINANCIAL
25	THRESHOLDS. WE REVISED THE POLICY TO REINFORCE

1	COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND SUPPLIER DIVERSITY STANDARDS
2	TO HELP ENSURE TRANSPARENCY AND COST-EFFECTIVENESS
3	IN PROCUREMENT DECISIONS. AND WE THINK THIS WILL
4	ENHANCE RECORDING AND COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS
5	THROUGHOUT THE POLICY BY HAVING STRICTER MONITORING
6	MEASURES THAT PROVIDE FOR BETTER ADHERENCE AND
7	FOLLOWING OF THE CONTRACT AND TRACKING OF THE
8	CONTRACT.
9	SO WITH THAT, I'M GOING TO TURN IT OVER TO
10	MICHELLE, IF YOU DON'T MIND.
11	MS. LEWIS: I DON'T. GOOD MORNING, CHAIR
12	AND MEMBERS OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE AND CIRM STAFF. SO
13	I'M GOING TO SHARE MY SCREEN. WE JUST HAVE A VERY
14	BRIEF POWERPOINT JUST TO SHOWCASE SOME OF THE
15	HIGHLIGHTS. HOPEFULLY EVERYONE CAN SEE THAT.
16	SO WE JUST WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT SOME OF THE
17	PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CURRENT CONTRACTING POLICY.
18	WE'VE REVISED AND STREAMLINED THE PREVIOUS POLICY ON
19	CONTRACTING AND SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONSULTANTS.
20	THE NEW POLICY WOULD BE TITLED "PURCHASING POLICY."
21	THE REVISED POLICY INCLUDES ALL PURCHASE
22	TYPES AND FOCUSES ON PROCUREMENT GOVERNANCE,
23	TRANSPARENCY, AND EFFICIENCY. IT REMOVES THE
24	OPERATING PROCEDURES TO FOCUS ON A STREAMLINED
25	DOCUMENT WITH A HIGH-LEVEL POLICY.

1	IN CONJUNCTION WITH THIS, WE WILL BE
2	DEVELOPING OPERATING PROCEDURES. THE FINANCE TEAM
3	WILL WORK WITH THE LEGAL TEAM TO ENSURE THAT THESE
4	ARE PROPER OPERATING PROCEDURES, AND WE WILL ALSO
5	DEVELOP A TRAINING FOR ALL CIRM STAFF.
6	THE REVISED POLICY REINFORCES COMPETITIVE
7	BIDDING AND SUPPLIER DIVERSITY WHILE ALSO
8	EMPHASIZING COMPLIANCE AND AUDITING MEASURES.
9	SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CHANGES ARE
10	THAT WE REMOVED DEFINITIONS FROM PAGES 1 AND 2; FOR
11	EXAMPLE, THE EMPLOYER TO EMPLOYEE RELATIONSHIP.
12	THEY ARE LOWER LEVEL IN SCOPE, AND THEY SHOULD BE
13	PLACED IN A STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE.
14	WE REMOVED LOWER-LEVEL SCOPE ALSO FROM
15	GENERAL POLICY AND PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS. THOSE WERE
16	PAGES 3 THROUGH 17 OF THE PREVIOUS POLICY; FOR
17	EXAMPLE, PROCUREMENT CONTRACT VERSUS PURCHASE ORDER.
18	THOSE ARE, AGAIN, MORE LOW-LEVEL DEFINITIONS THAT
19	ARE MORE APPLICABLE IN A STANDARD OPERATING
20	PROCEDURE.
21	WE ALSO REMOVED THE APPENDICES I THROUGH
22	III AS THEY APPLY TO ONLY NOT ONLY DO THEY APPLY
23	TO ONLY ONE TYPE OF CONTRACT, BUT THOSE ARE ALSO
24	DOCUMENTS THAT SHOULD BE PLACED IN A STANDARD
25	OPERATING PROCEDURE.

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1	AND AT THIS POINT, CIRM REQUESTS APPROVAL
2	OF THE PROPOSED PURCHASING POLICY.
3	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: THANK YOU VERY MUCH,
4	MICHELLE. DOES ANYONE HAVE ANY QUESTIONS FOR
5	MICHELLE? GEORGE, I THINK I SEE YOUR HAND UP.
6	DR. BLUMENTHAL: A QUICK QUESTION. AS I
7	UNDERSTAND IT, THE BOARD IS BEING ASKED TO APPROVE
8	THIS NEW POLICY WHICH HAS REMOVED THE PROCEDURES,
9	THE STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES, FROM THE POLICY
10	ITSELF SINCE THOSE PROCEDURES WOULD BE FORTHCOMING
11	AT A LATER TIME. ARE THOSE PROCEDURES THEN UNDER
12	PRESIDENTIAL DIRECTIVE RATHER THAN BOARD AUTHORITY
13	SO THAT THEY WILL BE DEVELOPED INTERNALLY BY THE
14	STAFF AND PUT IN PLACE WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
15	PRESIDENT? IS THAT A CORRECT STATEMENT OF WHAT WE
16	EXPECT TO HAPPEN.
17	MS. LEWIS: YES.
18	MR. AGUIRRE-SACASA: THAT'S CORRECT.
19	DR. BLUMENTHAL: OKAY.
20	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: ANY OTHER HANDS
21	RAISED, QUESTIONS FOR EITHER RAFAEL OR MICHELLE?
22	OKAY.
23	SO WOULD YOU LIKE ME ENTERTAIN A MOTION AT
24	THIS POINT TO APPROVE THE CHANGES TO THE PURCHASING
25	POLICY?
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1	MR. TOCHER: JUDY, THIS IS SCOTT. THE
2	MOTION WILL BE TO RECOMMEND TO THE FULL BOARD
3	APPROVAL OF THE CHANGES.
4	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: YES, CORRECT. YES,
5	CORRECT.
6	VICE CHAIR BONNEVILLE: SO MOVED.
7	DR. BLUMENTHAL: SECOND.
8	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: WHO WAS THE SECOND?
9	SORRY.
10	DR. BLUMENTHAL: I WAS.
11	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: THANKS, GEORGE.
12	OKAY. SCOTT, WOULD YOU CALL THE ROLL PLEASE.
13	MR. TOCHER: I'LL JUST GO THROUGH THE
14	FORMALITY OF ASKING FOR PUBLIC COMMENT. I DON'T
15	THINK WE HAVE ANY, AND I DON'T SEE ANY.
16	SO KIM BARRETT.
17	DR. BARRETT: AYE.
18	MR. TOCHER: GEORGE BLUMENTHAL.
19	DR. BLUMENTHAL: YES.
20	MR. TOCHER: MARIA BONNEVILLE.
21	VICE CHAIR BONNEVILLE: YES.

14	MR. TOCHER: JUDY, I THINK THE MEMO IS THE
15	ACCOMPANYING ITEM TO ITEM WE JUST HAD.
16	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: SO THERE'S NOTHING
17	DIFFERENT IN THE MEMO.
18	MR. TOCHER: CORRECT.
19	MR. AGUIRRE-SACASA: THAT WAS FOR
20	INFORMATIONAL PURPOSES FOR THE SUBCOMMITTEE AND THE
21	BOARD, JUDY, SO THAT YOU CAN HAVE MORE BACKGROUND ON
22	THE CHANGES AND THE UPDATES.
23	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: EXCELLENT. OKAY,
24	THEN. DOES ANYONE ON THE COMMITTEE HAVE ANYTHING
25	THEY WANT TO COMMENT ON AT THIS TIME? ANYTHING FROM
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1	THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC?
2	MR. TOCHER: DOESN'T APPEAR SO, JUDY.
3	CHAIRPERSON GASSON: OKAY. WELL, THIS WAS
4	A VERY EFFICIENT MEETING. SO THANK YOU TO RAFAEL,
5	TO SCOTT, AND TO MICHELLE. AND WE ARE ADJOURNED.
